### **Sarit Catz**

Speaker for *Inverting Truth: Recognizing Media Bias against Israel* on Tuesday, December 6, 2016.

Sarit Catz is the International Letter-Writing Director for CAMERA: *Committee for Accuracy in Middle East Reporting in America* where she monitors the media to expose factual inaccuracies and advocate for fair and factual reporting about Israel. She has won three *Writers Guild of America* awards and numerous awards for her short films. Ms. Catz graduated with Honors Distinction in International Relations from the University of Pennsylvania while earning a degree from the Wharton School in International Business.



### **Dr. Claudia Dunlea**

Speaker for *From Machtergreifung to Kristallnacht: The Nazi Persecution of the Jews* on Wednesday, November 9, 2016; *The Wannsee Conference: 90 Minutes that Changed the World* on Sunday, December 4, 2016; and *Modern Germany and the Legacy of the Holocaust* on Wednesday, April 5, 2017.

Dr. Claudia Dunlea is a Senior Instructor of History at Florida Atlantic University. Dr. Dunlea is the author of a renowned book that investigates the origins of a supranational European foreign policy in the 1950s. Her recent research on the diplomatic relations of the European Union was published in two articles. She received her doctorate in European Integration History from the University of Hamburg, Germany.

As the Nazis get closer, the staff desperately organizes the departure of the children for Switzerland and safety. When the children are suddenly left alone, eleven of them try to do the impossible and reach the Swiss border. Inspired by the autobiography of Fanny Ben-Ami, the film is an incredible tale of bravery, strength and survival.

### **Dr. Rosalie Franks**

Speaker for *Remembering for the Future: What Survivors Teach Us about Life and the Shoah* on Monday, March 13, 2017.

Dr. Rosalie Franks is a professor of Holocaust studies at Roger Williams University in Rhode Island. Her extensive interviews with Holocaust survivors are included in the Survivors of the Shoah Visual History Foundation. In 2015, the Palm Beach Fellowship of Christians and Jews honored Dr. Franks for promoting fellowship and respect among religions. A graduate of Smith College, Dr. Franks earned a master's degree from Columbia University and a doctorate from Boston University.



### **Caroline Glick**

Speaker for *The American Inquisition: BDS & United States Academia* on Sunday, November 13, 2016.

Caroline Glick is chief diplomatic correspondent for Israel's *Makor Rishon* newspaper, deputy managing editor of *The Jerusalem Post*, and the Senior Middle East Fellow at the Center for Security Policy. A frequent correspondent on several major television and radio networks in the US and Israel, her writings have appeared in global publications and have won numerous distinguished journalism awards. She has played a key role in the policy and coverage of The First Intifada, the Oslo Accords and Operation Iraqi Freedom. Ms. Glick also served as assistant foreign policy advisor to Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu. Ms. Glick earned a Master of Arts in Public Policy from Harvard University's Kennedy School of Government.

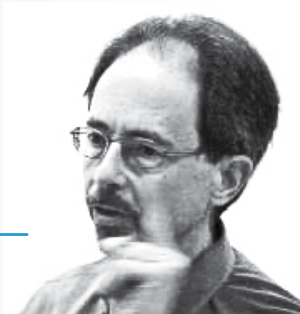
## Gross Center for the Study of Anti-Semitism and the Holocaust



### Capt. Martin Maxwell

Speaker for *From Vienna to the Pentagon*  
Sunday, February 19, 2017.

Having narrowly escaped from the Nazis, Maxwell participated in some of the most pivotal moments of WWII. He was a firsthand witness to Nazi atrocities, part of the D-Day forces landing in Normandy and one of the liberators of Holland; he was also a war crimes investigator at the Pentagon.



### Eric Rozenman

Speaker for *The Palestine Lie and the New Blood Libel: Mainstreaming Anti-Semitism*  
Wednesday, January 18, 2017.

Eric Rozenman is the communications consultant for the Jewish Policy Center, where he provides timely analysis of foreign and domestic policies as they relate to Israel's legitimacy and security. From 2002-2016, Rozenman served as the Washington director of CAMERA: *Committee for Accuracy in Middle East Reporting in America*. He has addressed biased reporting about Israel and published commentaries in several global and national publications. Mr. Rozenman is the author of two novels, *Total Jihad and Kill Them Before They Die*. Rozenman graduated from Ohio University with a bachelor's degree in journalism and Ohio State University with a master's in American History.
